- Overwhelming response was the difference made to the relationships between men and women which changed beyond recognition, with major shift to the empowerment of women
- Discusses global trend to support women rightly so.
   But how this has resulted in young men getting left behind
- Major concerns with unemployment with young men in Gunjur
- Opportunity to address this problem by supporting business entrepreneurs and those in early stages of start-up businesses
- Arkleton Trust Grant awarded to MBG earlier this year will allow WGEC to run a competition for UK students to produce business proposals – winners to go to Guniur
- Same competition to be run in Gunjur winner will receive £500 start-up loan
- Grant will allow training of eight young people, men and women, 1 from each kabilo to train for 1 year for City & Guilds
- New opportunities brought to Gunjur which now has electricity and running water for the first time
- MBG has been working with St James Place, Wealth Management Firm on the role Corporate Social Responsibility CSR in the Gambia

Any other Business	<ul> <li>Geoffrey Findlay comments now moving away from giving to Gambia and helping Gambia to help themselves through 1)entrepreneurship 2)CSR</li> <li>Asks David Morley how CSR is perceived politically – DM big business very keen, Most big business in Gambia off shore banks, manufacturing – already have CSR programs. Smaller organisations are Gambian owned, usually trained in UK so are also supportive of CSR</li> <li>Nick uses example of UK woman identifying a drop out rate of pubescent school girls, solution to produce sanitary towels to stop girls dropping out of school when they begin to menstruate</li> <li>Now a business in Gunjur employing female tailors to manufacture sanitary towels, MBG now supporting</li> <li>NM gives another example of entrepreneurship – collecting plastic bag rubbish and compressing into bricks to build houses</li> <li>Alexander Kirk-Wilson congratulates MBG on the</li> </ul>
